PERFORM A THOROUGH HAZARD ASSESSMENT AND TAKE MEASURES TO REDUCE OR REMOVE THE RISKS

COMMON RISK AFTER A STORM

(FALLING OBJECTS, PUNCTURES, CUTS, ELECTRICAL SHOCK,

EXPLOSION, CONFINED SPACES, HEAT INDEX, RESPIRATORY,

SLIPS, TRIPS, FALLS, AND MANY MORE)

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

(MOLD, ASBESTOS, LEAD BASED PAINT, AND CHEMICALS)

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)





HOW TO SAVE FAMILY PHOTOS AND DOCUMENTS

DO NOT SEPARATE
PHOTOS AND DOCUMENTS WHEN WET

PLACE THEM IN AN EMPTY FROST FREE FREEZER

FREEZE THEM AS FLAT AS POSSIBLE

ADD ICE MELT IN
SEPARATE CONTAINER
WITHOUT A LID

CONTACT A COMPANY WHO SPECILIZES IN PHOTOS AND DOCUMENT RESTORATION



HOW TO PROPERLY ADDRESS WATER DAMAGE

ANSI/IICRC S500

STANDARD FOR PROFESSIONAL WATER DAMAGE RESTORATION

DON'T BE DECEIVED BY "IT DOESN'T FEEL OR LOOK WET"

MUSTY ODORS INDICATE THAT THE WATER DETERIORATED

FIND WHERE THE WATER WENT (IT'S GOOD AT HIDING)

MOISTURE METERS - THERMAL CAMERAS - HYGROMETERS

DRY STANDARDS AND DRYING GOALS

THOROUGH DOCUMENTATION
(MOISTURE MAP, DRYING LOGS, TIME SHEETS)

HOW TO PROPERLY ADDRESS MOLD

ANSI/IICRC S520
STANDARD FOR PROFESSIONAL MOLD REMEDIATION

MOLD NEED'S THREE BASIC THINGS SOMETHING TO BREATHE-EAT-DRINK

IF YOU SEE IT ON THE ROOM SIDE OF A WALL
IT'S MOST LIKELY WORSE ON THE INSIDE ON THE WALL

WHAT THE BLEACH!
(DON'T SPRAY AND PRAY)

USE CONTAINMENT WITH NEGATIVE AIR PRESSURE

REMOVE ALL VISIBLE MOLD

(2FT UP, DOWN, AND OVER IN ALL DIRECTIONS)

HEPA SANDWICH
(HEPA VACUUM-WIPE-HEPA VACUUM)

DRY IT AND KEEP IT DRY



HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM MOLD

RESTRICT/LIMIT EXPOSURE (BREATHE - EAT - DRINK)

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT- PPE

REMOVAL IS THE GOAL (NOT COVERUP OR MAKE INVISIBLE)

DEAD AND DORMANT MOLD CAN STILL BE HAZARDOUS

DEMOLITION AND DISTURBANCE INCREASES RISK OF EXPOSURE

PRE AND POST REMEDIATION TESTING

KEEP THINGS DRY




SYMPTOMS OF MOLD EXPOSURE

RESPITORY COMPLICATIONS SHORTNESS OF BREATH SINUS CONGESTION RUNNY OR STUFFY NOSE SNEEZING SORE THROAT WHEEZING CHEST TIGHTNESS COUGHING SINUS INFECTION BROCHITIS **PNEUMONIA**

COLD & FLU LIKE SYMPTOMS **ASTHMA COMPLIMATIONS** HEADACHE MEMORY LOSS DIFFICULTY CONCENTRATING DIZZINESS FATIGUE JOINT PAIN SKIN RASHES OR IRRITATION WATERY, RED, OR ITCHY EYES NAUSEA OR VOMITING



IF YOU ARE EXPERIENCING ANY OF THE SYMPTOMS ABOVE LEAVE THE AREA AND SEEK THE ADVISE OF A MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL



HOW TO TELL IF A CONTRACTOR IS LEGIT

HIGH PRESSURE - HIGH ALERT!

NO CONTRACT - NO GOOD

BE CAREFUL WITH HIGH DOLLAR DEPOSITS

ASK FOR A COPY OF THEIR GENERAL LIABILITY AND WORKERS COMP INSURANCE

POLLUTION ENDORSEMENT FOR MOLD REMEDIATION COMPANIES

ARE THEY CERTIFIED?

ARE THEY LICENSED?
(PLUMBLING, ELECTRICAL, HVAC, AND ROOFING)

CAN THEY PROVIDE REFERRALS?

WHAT ARE THEIR ONLINE REVIEWS LIKE?

POLICY LANGUAGE MATTERS

EXCLUSIONS

SUDDEN AND ACCIDENTAL

RESTORED TO PRE-LOSS CONDITION

LIKE KIND AND QUALITY

NO UPGRADES - NO DOWNGRADES

REASONALLY INCURRED COST LESS THE DEDUCTIBLE

ADDITIONAL LIVING EXPENSES (ALE)

ORIDNANCE AND LAW (CODE UPGRADES)

ACTUAL CASH VALUE (ACV)

RECOVERABLE DEPRECATION (RCV)

ASK THE ADJUSTER TO SHOW YOU IN THE POLICY

PARTS OF AN INSURANCE CLAIM

NOTIFY YOUR AGENT THAT YOU MAY/MAY NOT NEED TO FILE A CLAIM

FILE THE INSURANCE CLAIM

MINIMZE SECONDARY DAMAGES

TYPES OF ADJUSTERS

ADJUSTERS WHO WORK ON BEHALF OF THE INSRURANCE COMPANY (GENERAL, CATASTROPIC, FIELD, DESK, CONTENTS, ALE, STAFF, & INDEPENDANT)

ADJUSTERS WHO WORK ON BEHALF OF THE INSRURED (PUBLIC)

SPECIALIZED EXPERTS

SUBMIT DOCUMENTATION

(PHOTOS, VIDEOS, RECEIPTS, AND ITEMIZED ESTIMATES)

MEET THE ADJUSTER WITH YOUR CONTRACTOR


